

Master of Engineering/Commonwealth Supported Places FACT SHEET FOR SEMESTER 1 2010 COMMENCEMENT

From 2010, both domestic and international students who have successfully completed the requirements of the Bachelor of Engineering degree at the University of Adelaide may be eligible to complete the Master of Engineering in 1 year of full-time study.

Successful applicants will be eligible to apply for a Commonwealth Supported Place.

Specialisations offered in the Master of Engineering include:

- Aerospace
- Chemical
- Civil & Environmental
- Civil & Structural
- Electrical & Electronic
- Mechanical
- Mechatronics

What GPA do I need to be eligible for a place in the Master of Engineering?

Eligibility for the Master of Engineering will not be based on GPA, but on successful completion of an undergraduate engineering degree in a relevant discipline. Both Honours and non-Honours graduates are eligible to apply.

Can I be guaranteed of completing the Master of Engineering in 1 year?

Completing the Master of Engineering in 1 year is possible providing that:

- A pass or better has been achieved in certain courses.
- A student wishes to enrol in a specialisation completed within the Bachelor award (students wishing to enrol in a new specialisation will be required to complete additional foundation courses).

In order to complete the program in 1 year, students must successfully complete the required coursework and undertake a full-time study load (24-units).

How do I apply for a place in the Master of Engineering?

Domestic students must lodge an application on SATAC's [GradStart](#) website. Applications are now open and can be made up until February 2010. International students must apply through the [International Office](#).

What is a Commonwealth Supported Place?

A [Commonwealth Supported Place](#) is a higher education place for which the Commonwealth makes a contribution towards the cost of a student's education. For further information on payment options refer to the [Going to Uni](#) website.

Are Commonwealth Supported Places available to international students?

Commonwealth Supported Places are available to Australian Citizens and Permanent Residents. Current international students must apply for a full fee-paying place through the [International Office](#) via the change of program process available in October.

Can I be guaranteed a Commonwealth Supported Place?

If a student meets the eligibility criteria and is offered and accepts a place in the Master of Engineering for Semester 1, 2010, a Commonwealth Supported Place can be assured.
