## The Defence Science and Technology Group (DSTG) Surveillance Systems Undergraduate Prize PRIZE RULES

### Establishment

This Prize has been established by a contribution to the University by The DSTG Surveillance Systems Division of the Defence Science and Technology Group (DSTG) for the purpose of establishing a prize in Electrical and Electronic Engineering, Computer Systems Engineering or Telecommunications Engineering.

In support of the prize the DSTG shall provide to the University as a result of a pledge request, an annual amount equivalent to \$300.00 (GST free).

### Value

The value of the Prize will be \$300.00 per year, until otherwise determined by the University after discussions with the contributor.

### Eligibility

The prize will be awarded annually by the University to the student in Level IV of the program for the degree of Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) (Electrical and Electronic), the degree of Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) (Computer Systems) or the degree of Bachelor of Engineering (Honours) (Telecommunications).

### Selection of Candidate

The Head of the School of Electrical and Electronic Engineering will award the prize to the student who most distinguishes themselves in one of the following courses: ELEC ENG 4068A/B, ELEC ENG 4101A/B, ELEC ENG 4102A/B, ELEC ENG 4104A/B, ELEC ENG 4105A/B, Honours Project, in an area of technology relevant to military surveillance systems such as radar, electro-optics, propagation and modelling, electromagnetic theory, antennas, optical physics, scattering, microwave, millimetre wave and optical components, radar imaging, signal and image processing or surveillance system studies.

If there is no candidate of sufficient merit in a given year then the prize will not be awarded in that year and the money will be used in subsequent years.

If there is more than one candidate of equal merit, then the prize shall be shared equally.

### Variations

The University may vary the rules from time to time in a manner consistent with the original objectives of the prize.
